

Next Week in English

Year 3

Next week in English, we will be beginning our new fiction unit which focuses on writing suspense. We will be learning our model text and practising techniques to build suspense using role play and show don't tell.

Year 4

Next week Year 4 will be creating their own stories based on the myth 'Theseus and the Minotaur'.

Year 5

Year 5 will be writing their own stories involving events that change a characters personality.

Year 6

Next week, Year 6 will be writing descriptive texts. The classes will have to include features such as: adjectives, adverbs, lists of three and a variety of punctuation.

Next Week in Maths

Year 3

We will begin next week by adding and subtracting in the context of money, and then begin to learn about place value and decimals.

Year 4

Year 4 are moving on from formal multiplication and short division to learning how to perform long division; firstly with no regrouping progressing to regrouping hundreds into tens and tens into ones.

Year 5

Next week in maths, Year 5 will be solving problems involving scaling, looking at rates and fractions.

Year 6

The children in Year 6 are consolidating their knowledge of mathematical concepts that have been taught throughout the year.
