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### Woodfield Primary School Primary School's Sports Funding

#### **What is the Sports Premium?**

The government has provided additional funding for academic years 2013-2018 to improve provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. This funding is being jointly provided by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport, and will see money going directly to Primary School Headteachers.

The purpose of this grant is to fund improvements to the provision of PE and Sport, for the benefit of pupils aged 5-11 years old, in the 2013 – 2018 academic years so that all pupils develop healthy lifestyles.

This funding is ring-fenced and therefore can only be spent on provision of PE and sport in schools. Schools must spend the additional funding on improving their provision of PE and Sport, but they will have the freedom to choose how they do this.

We believe we have a duty to make sure all our pupils have enough knowledge to understand how to make healthy choices for themselves. As Woodfield School we actively encourage all pupils to take part in our Forest School Programme, Eco Team and Gardening Club.

The grant funding for Woodfield Primary School has been allocated, as follows:

#### 2013-2014 (financial year)

PE Grant Funding = £5,438 (for period in academic year from September 2013-March 2014)

#### 2014-2015 (financial year)

PE Grant Funding = £2,972 (for period in academic year from April 2014 – August 2014)

PE Grant Funding = £5,438 (for period in academic year from September 2014 – March 2015)

#### 2015-2016 (financial year)

PE Grant Funding = £3,708 (for period in academic year from April 2015-August 2015)

PE Grant Funding = £5,200 (for period in academic year from September 2015 – March 2016)

#### 2016-2017 (financial year)

PE Grant Funding = £3,715 (for period in academic year from April 2016-August 2016)

PE Grant Funding = £5.203 (for period in academic year from September 2016-March 2017)

#### 2017-2018 (financial year)

PE Grant Funding = £3,717 (for period in academic year from April 2017-August 2017)

PE Grant Funding = £10,413 (for period in academic year from September 2017-March 2018)

#### **Provision in school**

At Woodfield, we provide a range of high quality Physical Education and wide range of sport, however, our intention is that this funding will further enhance the current provision in school.

The Governors agree that the funding must be used so that:

- All children benefit regardless of sporting ability
- All children have the opportunity to compete in competitions at some level
- The most able children are given the opportunity to participate in high level competitions
- Staff has access to training opportunities and continued professional development
- The new funding should increase the range of sports available to children

The PE and Sports Premium Grant will be used in a number of ways to impact on pupil attainment, these include:

- To work with the Wigan Primary Schools Sports Consortium to develop sporting skills and compete in Inter-school competitions



- Planning/Management time for teachers with a specialist sports coach.
- Employing a coach to provide weekly, after-school sport on the school site
- To increase competitive opportunities within school
- Employing expert advice to quality assure the work of sports coaches employed to coach in PE lessons eg Tennis Coaching
- Subsidising after school activities
- Transport to sporting events to allow as many children to participate as possible.
- Providing cover to release primary teachers for professional development in PE/sport
- Running sport competitions, or increasing participation in the school games
- Purchasing PE Resources
- Purchasing PE outdoor storage for new resource
- Buying into a School Sports Partnership
- Talent identification and intensive coaching of those identified as talented in PE and Sport
- CPD staff training
- Coaching by Wigan Athletic
- Accessing a wide range of internal and external sports competitions
- 5-A-Day sporting activities

#### **Reporting Outcomes**

Updates on outcomes relating to our provision for PE and sport will be provided throughout the school year via the school newsletters, our website/twitter feed and Sports Noticeboard.

The impact of the funding will also be reported annually to parents and governors via the school website and termly Governors Meetings.

#### **Financial Accountability**
