

Aims and objectives

Our policy for school uniform is based on the belief that school uniform:

- promotes a sense of pride in the school
- engenders a sense of community and belonging towards the school
- identifies the child with the school
- is practical, safe and smart
- makes children feel equal to their peers in terms of appearance
- is regarded as suitable wear for school and is considered by parents as good value for money
- is readily available at a variety of shops and is easy to purchase

All children from Reception to Year 6 are required to wear the correct school uniform every day. Where children repeatedly wear incorrect uniform, the school may supply, and require the child to wear, the correct items. School uniform is optional for children in Nursery.

The role of parents and carers

We ask all parents to support the school uniform policy. It is the responsibility of parents and carers to ensure that their child has the correct uniform and that it is clean and in good condition.

The school welcomes children from all backgrounds and faith communities. If there are serious reasons, for example medical or religious grounds, why parents want their child to wear clothes that differ from the school uniform, such requests must be put in writing to the Headteacher.

Where there are difficulties obtaining school uniform, for example for financial reasons, the school may be able to supply some second-hand uniform as a temporary measure.

Our uniform colours are black and yellow. Our official sweatshirts and other uniform can be purchased from School Uniform Direct <http://schooluniformdirect.co.uk/Products.aspx?stig=122>. All items are readily and cheaply available at many high street stores and supermarkets. We expect **every child to wear school uniform** when attending school and when participating in a school-organised event outside normal school hours. Please ensure all items of uniform are labelled with the child's name.

Daily School Uniform

Black sweatshirt or cardigan with school logo

or

Plain **black v-neck jumper, cardigan or sweatshirt** (no hoods, stripes or logos)

Plain **white or yellow polo shirt, with or without the school logo**

or

Plain **white shirt** with collar, short or long-sleeved

Plain **black or dark grey school trousers or shorts** (not leggings, jogging bottoms, tracksuit trousers or sports shorts)

or

Plain **black or grey skirt or pinafore** dress, with plain black, grey or white tights or socks

Yellow and white checked **summer dress** (A plain, white cardigan may be worn with a summer dress but not with any other uniform.)

Sensible, flat **black shoes** or trainers; in summer, flat, sturdy, black or white sandals (boots are not suitable for wearing in school – in poor weather, children may wear boots to school but must bring sensible school shoes to change into).

PE/Sports Kit


Please ensure your child brings their PE kit to school **every Monday**. Our children take part in a range of sports activities throughout the week, and need a PE kit in school every day. They should **leave their PE kit in school all week**, and take it home for washing at the weekend.

Plain **yellow or white t-shirt with or without school logo** (no stripes or logos)

Plain **black shorts or jogging bottoms** (no stripes or logos)

Trainers or black plimsolls

Junior children may use roll-on deodorant; we do not allow hair spray, hair gel, talcum powder or spray deodorant. **Children must remove any small earrings during PE, or these will be taped over to prevent any accidents.**



We do not allow children to wear jewellery, nail varnish or make-up in school, except for very small, simple stud earrings in pierced ears; a watch and one item of religious significance are also allowed. Hair bows/bands should be black, white or yellow. Hijabs, turbans or patkas should be plain black, white or grey.
