Passport to Experiences

The Passport to Experience is our unique way of providing curricular enrichment in respect of the pupil's spiritual moral cultural and personal development. Each pupil is issued with their own passport which entitles to them to additional experiences which are categorised as cultural physical spiritual and wildcard. Experiences included taking part in visits to places of religious worship, inter school sports competitions, visits to theatres and cinemas as well as some experiencing a residential visit. Once each experience is completed the pupil receives a stamp and a photograph in the aim is for each pupil to collect a stamp for each area of experience every year.
