Pupil Premium Statement

This policy was adopted in the Summer term 2013 and updated May 2018

1.INTRODUCTION

The Government believes that the Pupil Premium Grant (PPG), which is additional to main school funding, is the best way to address the current underlying inequalities between children eligible for free school meals (FSM) and Children Looked After (CLA) and their peers.

The Pupil Premium Grant is paid to schools by Local Authorities. The funding is calculated using the January School Census and Looked After Children Data Returns. The school allocates the funding where it is most likely to have an impact on our Six Life Long Learning Skills (communication, independence, taking part, choosing, working with others, and keep on trying) which are embedded throughout our school curriculum.

As part of the school's regular performance monitoring we will be evaluating the impact of the PPG. Achievements and progress data will be checked frequently and regular liaison will take place with staff. This will enable assessment as to whether interventions and techniques are working which can then be adjusted accordingly.
