Next Week in English

Year 3

Next week, Year 3 will be writing their own stories using techniques to create suspense and tension.

Year 4

Next week in English, Year 4 will be planning and writing an information text about a mythical creature.

Year 5

Next week, Year 5 will be starting to write their own instructional text based on 'How to Kill a Dragon'.

Year 6

This week, Year 6 will be learning and performing their play for the end of the year. The classes will have to speak with volume, expression and read a playscript.

Next Week in Maths

Year 3

Next week, we will be securing our knowledge of place value with decimal numbers. This will include learning how to regroup decimal numbers in different ways.

Year 4

This week, Year 4 will learn to identify acute and obtuse angles and compare and order angles up to two right angles, by size. They will compare and classify geometric shapes, including quadrilaterals and triangles, based on their properties and sizes. Children will learn to use negative numbers. They will be counting through zero and calculating in context. They will learn to solve problems involving negative numbers.

Year 5

Next week, Year 5 will be camping and then will be making kites. In moaths after that, we will be looking at statistics and understanding data.

Year 6

This week, Year 6 will be learning and performing their play for the end of the year.
