We are delighted to be able to share the news with you, that our school has been judged 'Good' by Ofsted. We would like to thank the whole school community for the work that has gone towards achieving this outcome.

You will see, when reading the report, that we were judged 'Good' for 'Effectiveness of leadership and management', 'Quality of teaching, learning and assessment', 'Personal development, behaviour and welfare' and 'Early Years Provision'. The school was judged as 'Requires Improvement' for 'Outcomes' based on the school's poor performance results over the last three years. If you read the 'Outcomes' section of the report however, you will see that it is still a very positive read in terms of the rapid improvements that have been made this year. We have been disappointed that a couple of families have decided to take their children out of school for holidays recently; particularly alarming, has been how absence has been reported by families as 'sickness' rather than 'holiday' absence.
