Ways to help over summer

Current Reception: Letter formation and recognition, reading regularly to practise sounding out and blending, counting, reading and writing numbers to 20 (and beyond!).

Year 1: Counting forwards and backwards. Recognising and writing numbers to 100. Writing using full stops and capital letters consistently.

Year 2: Times tables (2, 5 and 10), number bonds and joined-up, neat handwriting with correct punctuation.
