



Dear Parents,




Wow what an active week we have had! The children have completed a ½ mile run every morning, taken part in physical challenges each day and practiced the skills for and taken part in sports day. We are really proud of them all for their positive attitudes and for the lovely feedback we received from their team leaders. We decided to celebrate their success with certificates. The children have decorated them with their favourite colours.



In phonics this week the children have revisited the trigraphs 'ear' and 'air' and practiced writing sentences using finger spaces, capital letters and consistent sized letters. You might like to encourage them to practise their sentence writing in their sharing book about something you do over the weekend.



In maths this week the children have continued to learn about number bonds. They have practiced finding two numbers to make 10 using beanbags and hoops and using numicon. You might like to support them to practise this using the game attached. The instructions are at the top of the page. If your child is ready for a challenge after completing this game you might like to play it again asking them to find number bonds to 20.



### Sharing Book Challenge

➤ This week my sharing book challenge is to measure how far they can jump from standing, how long they can stand on one leg and how many jumps they can do in 30 seconds. Please record this in their sharing book for us to compare during next week.



### Next Week:
