



North Ferriby CE Primary School Pupil Premium Statement for
September 2018 to September 2019:

Total Pupil Premium funding received in school year 2017-18	£44,500
Total number of Pupil Premium pupils during school year 2017/18	31 pupils

A range of initiatives were deployed to support children to ‘bridge the gap’ in performance. The Pupil Premium supported the funding of the following provisions:

- Small group work.
- 1:1 support.
- Additional teaching and learning opportunities provided through trained Teaching Assistants or external agencies.
- Acquiring effective materials aimed at raising standards, particularly in reading and mathematics.
- Social and nurturing groups (using Emotional Literacy Support Assistants – ELSAs)

Pupil Premium attainment for Maths was a focus last year and shown a marked improvement as a result. Attainment for reading has continued to rise and Writing has shown a slight dip. Pupil Premium attainment for Writing will be a focus for the school year 2018/19.

Progress:

- Previously 9 children in maths were not making GOOD progress; this year that has reduced to 5.
- 5 children in writing were not making GOOD progress – that is now down to only 1 pupil.
- One child in reading; one pupil in writing and five pupils in maths did not make expected progress. They will be targeted next year to ensure they make accelerated progress.

Focus for school year 2018 - 2019:

1. 74% of our pupil premium pupils were at Age Related Expectations for writing which was a slight dip from the previous year (77%). Extra intervention will be put in place to ensure that this improves by the end of the school year. Progress towards this will be monitored by governors each term.
2. 1 pupil in writing, 1 pupil in reading and 5 children in maths did not made sufficient progress this year. These children have been highlighted to their new class teachers. Using the funding allocated to their class they will ensure that interventions take place to accelerate progress for these children.
3. All class teachers are aware of their pupil premium pupils and of the funding allocated to their class. They are also aware of the availability of our two ELSAs which can be used to ensure that external influences do not have a negative impact on the progress of the pupil premium children in their class.
4. Staff CPD will look at 'Reading for Pleasure' (to develop vocabulary), 'Philosophy for Children' and 'Building Relationships with Families'.

This will be spend in the following ways:

Emotional Literacy Support Assistants (£10000):

2 full time trained ELSAs are available to provide support for the social and emotional needs of all Pupil Premium pupils.

Teaching Assistants (£28000):

High quality TAs have been allocated to each class according to the numbers of Pupil Premium Pupils in each class. TAs will be used to deliver relevant interventions, to give support with social and emotional needs and to cover the class teacher so that they can give quality feedback, develop 'Reading for Pleasure' and to build relationships with the families.

Staff CPD (£3000):

Staff will be trained on the following areas which have been identified as key to ensuring GOOD progress for all Pupil Premium pupils:

- Reading for Pleasure and Developing Vocabulary
- Nurturing Principles (Family Links)
- Giving Quality Feedback
- Investing in Relationships with Families
- Philosophy for Children

Classroom Resources (£1000):

Money will be used to develop the classroom resources to support 'Reading for Pleasure', to develop writing skills and to build on drama activities.
