| ERYC Music Service | £2000 | Allows release of Teaching staff to support Pupil Premium (PP) children 1-1 and in small groups in R,W and M | PP children are meeting their targets in R,W and M |
| To support PP children to achieve expected swimming qualifications of 25M | £1235 | To ensure that all PP children have the opportunity to have swimming lessons to enable them to achieve the 25M standard at YR6 | All PP have the life skill of being able to swim 25m and are confident in water. |
| Residential/ Visits/Transport subsidy/Visitors into school | £1700 | This is particularly important due to the geographical isolation of Roos. | The children have access to a wider curriculum and their confidence and social skills are developed. They are having experiences that they may not have outside of school |
| To ensure staffing levels remain the same to ensure high quality provision for children | £14000 | To ensure that each class has a TA, to enable the teacher to complete interventions as required with individuals and small groups of PP children. | PP children achieve their full potential by additional support from the class teacher/TA. |
| Pastoral Support for individual children | £500 | To ensure individual children have equal access to the curriculum and school life. | Individual children have equality of education. |
| Provision of snack for those children who may not have had breakfast | £900 | To maintain concentration levels throughout the school day and give all children equal access to their learning. | Equality of education. |
| Provision of school uniform | £600 | To ensure PP children have access to appropriate school uniform including PE kit. | Children feel included in all aspects of school life. |
| Provision of high quality reading resources including books | £1425 | To ensure PP children have access to high quality reading materials. | Children will be more confident in their reading skills. Attainment in reading for PP children will increase. Lifelong learning. |
