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St Anne's Sixth Form College

This guide is to provide an overview of the provision for post 16 students and their families.

The Sixth Form College has an open door policy and staff welcome the opportunity to liaise with parents, carers, agencies and other professionals to ensure a successful transition into our post 16 provision and further provision post 19.

Vision and Aims

The Sixth Form College is recognised by Ofsted as being outstanding in preparing the students in Life Skills and ensuring their transition from College to adulthood as seamless and enjoyable as possible.

Our aim is to offer a wide range of work related placements with a focus on qualifications and awards to prepare the students for life after the sixth form. The curriculum is based upon a three year rolling programme with a different focus for each year.

The Sixth Form Staffing Structure

There are a number of learning support staff working in the Sixth Form College who assist the class teacher's in the successful delivery of the curriculum.

The Curriculum

All students follow a broad and balanced curriculum which includes Maths, English, PSHCE, ICT, RE, PE / Leisure, Creative arts including Drama, Food Technology, Work placements, Skills 4 Life which covers 7 key areas focusing on independence. Some students will access Humber Night Challenge, Rock Challenge and a residential through the Duke of Edinburgh award.



Caring for animals

Year 1

Students will access two off-site activities through external providers. Currently they are Welton Waters Activity Centre and Bishop Burton College. Both activities are full days, including lunch off-site.

Through the Archbishop of York, Youth Trust Young Leaders Award, students will continue to further develop their English and maths skills.

The students are involved in baking produce for the Friday Café and the Pop-Up Café for our Drivers and Escorts. Both enterprises offer students on site work placements. Any profits are used to support Sixth form projects decided by the Sixth Form Council.

Clothing & equipment needed.

1. Please ensure your son / daughter comes dressed appropriately for **Welton Waters**, ie, trousers, warm clothing adequate for this water based activity. A complete change of warm clothing including foot wear, a towel, and toiletries. Please ensure all belongings are named.
2. Please ensure your son / daughter comes dressed appropriately for **Bishop Burton College** ie, trousers, warm clothing adequate for this off site / out door activity including sensible foot wear.

Year 2

Students will access three off-site activities through external providers. Currently they are Hessle High School as part of the Hessle Federation for Re-cycling, Swimming at a local leisure centre, and Elloughton church hall for Arts award. When attending Elloughton church hall lunch is off-site.

Clothing & equipment needed.

1. Please ensure your son / daughter comes dressed appropriately for **Hessle re-cycling project** ie, trousers, warm clothing adequate for this off site activity. Please ensure all belongings are named.
2. Please ensure your son / daughter comes with the necessary items for **swimming**, costume/trunks, towel and toiletries.
3. **Elloughton church hall** no specified clothing is required.

Through the Asdan Towards Independence Award students will continue to further develop their English and maths skills and life skills.

The students are involved in a half day on site activity Freedom KDC with an external provider, who works with our students to produce, planters, wooden outdoor furniture, and garden ornaments.

Year 3

Students are involved in the Duke Of Edinburgh Award, will access Transitional Visits in preparation for transition post 19 as well as work placements on and off site.

Through food technology the students learn skills to enable them to prepare, cook and enjoy a simple meal.

The students are involved running two enterprise business, the café and School shop. Any profits go into support Sixth Projects decided by the Sixth Form Council.

The emphasis is on functional Maths and English with students compiling their records of achievements; working on their CV's and developing interview skills.

Clothing & equipment needed.

1. *The Duke of Edinburgh* course will need specialist clothing your son / daughter for the expedition and different tasks.
