



# Home-School Agreement

We are committed to working in partnership with parents to enable children to thrive.

## Staff will:

- Provide a balanced, stimulating and appropriately challenging curriculum.
- Enable every child to achieve their best.
- Inform parents about the curriculum through home-learning activities, half-termly newsletters and the school website.
- Inform parents about their child's progress through informal discussions, consultation evenings and termly reports.
- Model the school behaviour expectations.
- Praise and promote positive behaviour and expect each child to do their best.
- Be consistent and fair in applying the school's behaviour policy.
- Work with families to address any social, emotional, behavioural or learning difficulties.

## Families will:

- Ensure that your child attends school, arrives on time and is well equipped to learn.
- In the event of absence due to illness parents/carers should telephone the school at the earliest opportunity.
- Ensure that your child is collected on time by an adult known to the school.
- Attend information evenings which are relevant to your child's education or meetings which concern your child's education or wellbeing.
- Promote, model and support the school's behaviour policy and expectations.
- Encourage your child to take responsibility for their behaviour and any consequences.
- Ensure that your child's belongings are clearly named and encourage your child to take responsibility for their belongings in school.
- Ensure that your child wears the correct school uniform, including P.E. kit.
- Support your child to complete home-learning activities to the best of their ability.
- Read with your child on a daily basis and record this in your child's Reading Record/Planner.
- Work in partnership with the school to address any issues which affect your child's learning.

## Children will:

- Attend school and arrive on time.
- Follow the school's behaviour expectations.
- Take responsibility for your behaviour and any consequences.
- Wear the correct school uniform, including P.E. kit.
- Take responsibility for your belongings.
- Complete the work set (at school and at home) to the best of your ability.
- Read on a daily basis.
- Make a positive contribution to the school community.
