



Upper 2 – Autumn 2018

SCIENCE – Habitats

Students will explore and compare the differences between things that are living, dead, and things that have never been alive. They will learn that most living things live in habitats to which they are suited and identify and name a variety of plants and animals.

PSHCE – Being Me in My World/Celebrating Difference

Students will learn how everyone is special and their rights and responsibilities as they are growing older. They will learn to accept that they can be different and the similar to others in the class and how to work together. They will learn about the importance of being nice to each other and what to do if they or someone they know is being bullied.

ART- Water

Students will use drawing, painting and sculpture to develop and share their ideas, experiences and imagination on the theme of water. They will learn about the work of a range of artists including Monet, describing the differences and similarities and making links to their own work.

DT- Money Containers

Students will explore commercially available products which are used as money containers – purses, wallets and money boxes. They will have the opportunity to use a range of tools and be shown how to do so safely. They will be encouraged to select from and use a wide range of materials including textiles, according to their characteristics.

GEOGRAPHY – Brazil

Students will use world maps, atlases and globes to identify the UK and Brazil, their continents and the seas that surround them. They will learn about similarities and differences of where they live in the UK and parts of Brazil. This will include houses, transport, landscape and schools.

HISTORY – People Who Help Us

Students will learn about how the police, medical and fire services and compare now with the past. They will investigate achievements of Florence Nightingale and Mary Seacole and how they helped to improve conditions for people in the past.

COMPUTING – We are Collectors

Students will use web search engines to collect pictures of different types of animals and then explore ways in which those pictures can be organised. They will be helped to store, manipulate and retrieve digital content. They will learn about Online Safety and how to protect themselves online and who to go to for help if they need it.

RE – Belonging

Students will explore the idea of belonging to groups including religions and other traditions. They will begin to recognise commitment to a way of life or cause. Students will explore rules for living including class, school and home rules.

MUSIC – African and Indian Music

The students will learn to use their voices expressively and creatively by singing songs and speaking chants and rhymes including songs for Harvest Festival and Christmas. They will learn and perform action songs from India and Africa. Students will have the opportunity to play traditional musical instruments and also use iPad apps.

PE – Team Games/Developing Skills/Striking and Fielding Games

The students will develop their throwing, catching, batting and following instructions skills ready to take part in team games in school and out in the community at sports events.

Swimming

The students will follow a course of 10 lessons at Goole Leisure Centre where they will develop water confidence and swimming skills.
