<u>Learning Overview: Autumn 2018 (1st half term)</u> <u>Year Group: 1</u>

Topic: Once Upon a Time

Foundation Subjects

<u>Science:</u> We will be looking at the body this half term. Naming body parts, undertaking a senses investigation and looking at similarities and differences of ourselves and others.

<u>ICT:</u> Our Computing unit this term is called 'We are storytellers' and we will be recording a traditional tale using the microphone on the laptops and then inserting the recording into a PowerPoint of the story.

Geography WE will be learning about our locality home, school and the neighbourhood. We will be looking at different physical features of the locality as well as learning about the difference between the urban and rural environment and what terms such as village, town, city, coastal regions, mountains, forests, rivers etc.

RE: In RE, we will start by looking at special people in our lives and sharing our own experiences before moving on to look at special people in Christianity, Hinduism and Sikhism.

PSHCE: Our PSHCE this half term links in with our Science and focuses on growing and changing. We will start off by thinking about things we can do now that we couldn't do as a baby and go on to think about things we will be able to do in the future. We will also be naming the external and internal (non-sexual) body parts.

<u>PE:</u> In Gym we be learning about moving about safely, awareness of space and other people and different ways of moving. We will also be playing playground games to encourage a range of play at break times and while the weather is good, we hope to continue to do our P.E. outside.

Art: We will be using our work on the body in Science to make a composite child and creating a portrait of a friend while looking at the similarities and differences between us all.

<u>DT:</u> We will be making gingerbread men to link with our story telling unit in which we will read The Gingerbread Man.

<u>Music:</u> This is a six-week Unit of Work. All the learning is focused around one song: Hey You! by Joanna Mangona which is a Hip Hop song for children. We will play games which help us identify the pulse, rhythm, pitch etc. Then we will try to learn the song and add instruments.

Homework:

- Please read regularly with your child to complete the 3 books given each week, books will be changed on a Tuesday.

 - Practising counting forwards and backward to at least 20.
 - Find pairs of numbers that total 5, 6, 7, 8, 9 or 10.
