Impact on pupils' participation:	<p>A number of children in Key stage 2 were involved in sporting competitions, fostering qualities of competitiveness, sportsmanship and team spirit whilst developing skills and engaging in healthy activities.</p> <p>Whole school sports day held at Spring Hall – The Bolton Brow Games, every child participated and worked with peers across the school.</p>

<p>Impact on pupils' attainment:</p>	<p>All staff received CPD from a specialist RealPE coach to ensure that quality PE lessons are delivered, supporting the Real PE scheme.</p> <p>Planned successive tennis sessions aimed solely at Year 1 & 2 to develop ball skills and coordination.</p> <p>26 out of 30 Year 5 children have met the National Standard of 25metres, with many exceeding this. Improving on 23/30 in 2016 and 24/30 in 2017.</p> <p>Increased knowledge and awareness of healthy lifestyles and appropriate diets from specialised coach working with children from year 2 to 6.</p>
<p>How the premium has allowed pupils to develop active lifestyles:</p>	<p>Extra and extended swimming sessions ensure children are exercising more and for longer whilst raising attainment.</p> <p>Commitment of 2 hours a week of quality PE for all year 1 to 6.</p> <p>We ensured a high percentage of OOSH clubs were active and appealing to children, many led by specialist coaches.</p> <p>Specialised coach worked with all year groups from 2 to 6 to educate children on healthy lifestyles and eating.</p> <p>More opportunities to participate in new activities.</p> <p>All Key Stage 1 children given the opportunity to experience bikes and learn a new skill.</p>

<p>How the school will sustain the improvements:</p>	<p>Continue out links with the Sowerby Bridge Sporting cluster and hopefully the Calderdale School Sports Programme, also taking on more responsibility for large schools football festival.</p> <p>Continued employment of known RealPE specialist coaches to deliver CPD in other areas of the curriculum to develop skills and knowledge for all staff.</p> <p>Arrangements made to change the organisation of the swimming programme so that Year 4 children will swim for a full year from Spring 2 to Summer 2 in Year 4 and then Autumn 1 to Spring 1 in Year 5.</p> <p>Year 3 to swim in Summer 2 to build water confidence.</p> <p>Bolton Brow Games to continue to be an annual event. Children to continue running 1km every Monday and Friday.</p> <p>Continue offering outdoor and adventurous opportunities through forest school provision, Lakes residential and ROKT climbing facility.</p> <p>Improve the playground markings, particularly highlighting the 1km running track.</p>
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
