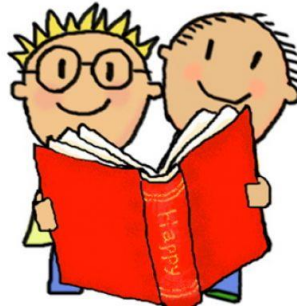
Key Stage 2 SATS

Explaining the SATs

All pupils will take just one set of tests which cover the complete range of abilities.

The tests help measure the progress pupils have made in their time here at Ladygrove. The tests are also used to assess schools' performance, to produce national performance data and to measure progress when your children get to GCSEs. The key stage 2 tests will be taken on set dates unless your child is absent, in which case they may be able to take them up to 5 school days afterwards.

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Explaining the SATs – GRAMMAR, PUNCTUATION AND SPELLING

- There is a greater focus on knowing and applying terminology with the full range of punctuation being assessed.
- There is one paper for grammar, punctuation and vocabulary (out of 50) and one paper for spelling (out of 20).

Explaining the SATs – GRAMMAR, PUNCTUATION AND SPELLING

- There is an emphasis on multiple choice questions.
- Spelling and punctuation must be correct for marks to be achieved in many of the questions.
- **ALL children can ask to have any question read to them at any time in any paper (except reading).**


