We are all working on measurements, area and perimeter which allows us to really use maths in practical contexts. In years 5/6 we are using it to explore garden design and then we will look at volume and capacity whilst creating packaging for our own new brand of cereal. Throughout the rest of this term we are focussing on exploring and explaining our maths so that we can show that we really understand not only the core principles underlying what we're doing but also how we can efficiently apply our knowledge in the real world.

Are you tick aware?

Ticks are small spider-like creatures that feed on the blood of animals, including people. They are found in woodland, grassland and moorland where there is a dense vegetation layer and can be found in some urban parks and gardens.



So, don't panic. Most tick bites are harmless and only a small number of ticks are infected with the bacteria that cause Lyme disease. A tick can only cause Lyme disease in humans if the tick has already bitten an infected animal.





How do I remove a tick?

- 1. Use fine-tipped tweezers or a tick-removal tool you can buy these from some pharmacies, vets and pet shops.
- 2. Grasp the tick as close to the skin as possible.
- 3. Slowly pull upwards, taking care not to squeeze or crush the tick. Dispose of it when you've removed it.
- 4. Clean the bite with antiseptic or soap and water.

You must visit your GP if you've been bitten by a tick or visited an area in the past month where infected ticks are found, and you get flu like symptoms – such as feeling hot and shivery, headaches, aching muscles, nausea or a circular red rash, resembling a bullseye. Treating Lyme disease is easiest when diagnosed at the earliest point. In most cases you will be given a 3 week course of antibiotics. It is important to finish the course of antibiotics even if you begin to feel better.


