How can you help your child to develop a good work ethic?

A work ethic is learned behaviour, and as a parent you're the one who teaches your children to acquire it. If you're like most parents, you want your children to work hard and derive meaning and satisfaction from what they do.

Five ways to help:

1. Responsibility. Follow through on your own obligations and promises, and expect your children to do the same. When you have to work extra on a project, use that as a teaching moment - sometimes personal sacrifices need to be made to do a good job.
2. Effort. Demonstrate how to schedule and perform household tasks. Maintain high standards for chores around the house. Your children don't have to be masterminds to get ahead. Success often goes to the people who know how to get the job done and are willing to do what it takes.
3. Persistence. Give praise for jobs that are done well, and discuss jobs done incompletely. Expect your children to complete their tasks, sticking to them until they are done to the agreed upon standard.
4. Focus. Expect all homework and school assignments to be done completely, neatly, and on time. They may have other activities to do, but they need to give their full focus (and effort) to each.
5. Punctuality. Take your children to school and other activities on time. Teach them the importance of being on time, by being punctual for your own obligations as well.
