As well as after school clubs, children have been provided with opportunities to participate in adventurous activities in Years 5 & 6 during their residential visits to Stubbers and Sealyham activity centres. All of these activities were led by specialist instructors. Children participated in many activities they wouldn't usually get the chance to do and for many of them, conquered fears during character and team building activities.

Year 3 pupils have had the opportunity to take part in swimming lessons on a weekly basis as part of their weekly PE sessions.

Year 6 pupils have not had swimming lessons this school year but the following information has been collated regarding their swimming capabilities:

49/57 pupils can swim competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of at least 25 metres

43/57 pupils can use a range of strokes effectively

43/57 pupils can perform safe self-rescue in different water-based situations

As a result of this data - PE funding is to be allocated for Years 4/5/6 so that each year group will benefit from a term's swimming session to ensure that as many pupils as possible leave our school able to swim to an adequate standard.
