Some of the students in Key Stage 3 and Key Stage 4 will be following a SCERTS programme.

This is a multidisciplinary approach to enhance communication and social-emotional abilities.

SCERTS refers to Social Communication, Emotional Regulation and Transactional Support.

All students following this programme have communication targets that are continued throughout the day in all lessons. Communication is helped by using symbols, Objects of Reference, Intensive Interaction and Tac Pac (Movement) when necessary. Visual timetables, symbol strips, signing and verbal instructions and in some cases communication aids are used.

Throughout the curriculum there is emphasis on Life Skills and independence. Basic Skills (maths and Fnalish) and fine motor skills are incorporated in all lessons. Each day

the students start with Teacch tasks, followed by exercise, either the Sensory Circuit or the trampolines.

Sports Events

KS3 and KS4 students will attend sporting events throughout the year within the East Riding. These events bring together local East Riding Special Schools to compete in various sporting events that encourage independent learning, team work and also lots of fun.



Additional Curriculum activities

Year 11 students are offered the opportunity of attending a residential and both KS3 and KS4 students are offered the chance to take part in Disport, Humber Night Challenge and swimming lessons.



Dance

The students learn different types of dance routines from around the world. They use different sensory equipment to support their movement to music. They are given the opportunity to respond to music by moving their own body to the tempo of the music. Students learn a sequence of dance steps expressing creativity, space and movement of the body as a whole.

KS3

The students access a practical curriculum that encourages them to socialise and build on life skills that prepare them for their future. As a key stage they take part in cookery lessons related to 'Active Kids' cookery awards and also visit different cafes and shops in our local community.

Homework

Homework is not compulsory as we realise that some students do not like to complete school work at home. If, however, you would like extra homework please ask the class teacher.

KS4

Students in KS4 continue to access a practical curriculum as in KS3 to help build on existing knowledge and develop their ideas further. The students follow the AQA award system in a variety of areas including: English, Maths, Computing, Independent Living Skills, Safety in the workplace, Leisure and Basic Skills. All of these areas allow the students to gain qualifications whilst undertaking practical work. They also complete ASDAN awards in Expressive Arts and Work right. In KS4 the students start to attend a weekly work placement and will complete written work as park of their qualification which link to and support this.
