



Physical Education and Sport Premium 2017-18



The Government provides additional funding each year to improve the provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. This funding - provided jointly by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport - is allocated directly to primary school Headteachers. The funding is ring-fenced and therefore can only be spent on the provision of PE and sport in schools.

Oakworth Primary School received £19,570 for the academic year 2017-18.

Purpose of funding

Schools must spend the additional funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but they have the freedom to choose how they do this.

How Oakworth Primary used the funding	Impact
<p>A specialist Forest Schools' Provider was employed to work alongside teaching and support staff. All children from Nursery to Year 6 benefited from blocks of half-day sessions, linked to their thematic learning in the classroom.</p> <p>This provision secured coverage of the Outdoor and Adventurous Activity element of the PE curriculum and utilised the School's outdoor environment to enhance and support curriculum learning.</p> <p>(£6080 for our Forest Schools' Provider)</p>	<p>All children from Reception to Year 6 have completed blocks of Forest Schools' sessions. This has led to enhanced learning in the OAA area of the curriculum and has expanded children's learning around classroom topics.</p> <p>Staff participation has also increased their skills and confidence in facilitating outdoor learning.</p>
<p>Our PE Leader had additional time each week (two hours) to track attendance at after-school clubs and events and to facilitate sporting opportunities for all.</p> <p>We run many sports clubs in school, which allow for a competitive element and development of skills as well as encouraging an active lifestyle.</p> <p>Clubs such as netball, dodgeball, cheerleading, table tennis and cycling have been facilitated to tempt more pupils to attend. Local sports' coaches/companies have provided expert coaching.</p> <p>Friendly fixtures have been organised for pupils who have not been selected for school teams.</p> <p>Able pupils have accessed new competitions, such as triathlon and boccia and a wide variety of local leagues and festivals. They have also facilitated clubs for younger pupils.</p> <p>(£2022.50 for our PE Leader and £80 for Rugby Coaching sessions)</p>	<p>The PE Leader maintains a record of take-up of extra-curricular clubs and encourages all pupils to attend at least one a year.</p> <p>More pupils attended before/after school sports clubs in 2017-18 than in previous years.</p> <p>A targeted club has supported specific children's behaviour in school and built their self-esteem.</p> <p>The school obtained the Gold Schools' Games Mark for competitive sport in 2017-18 and also won a Yorkshire PE and Sport Premium 2018 award for Broader Sporting Experience.</p>

An instructor has run an extra before- school 'Fun and Fitness' club, aimed at supporting and engaging pupils identified as least active. (£535.84 for our Fitness Instructor)	Previously inactive pupils have taken part in and have enjoyed regular exercise; improving their fitness, motivation and self-esteem.
The school has laid artificial turf around our Trim Trail (adjacent to the main playground) to enable it to be used throughout the whole school year. (£7325.63 for our Trim Trail artificial turf)	Children across the school are more active at playtimes, as the Trim Trail can be utilised throughout the winter months. This also supports physical and motor skill development.
To further increase lunchtime activity levels, the school employed a Play Leader for three lunchtime sessions per week. (£2021.03 for our Play Leader)	Games and activities were organised at lunchtime to engage and motivate children to exercise. Levels of participation have been high.
Not only have we purchased PE equipment for curriculum PE lesson time, money has also been used to continue to provide better resources for children to be active during lunchtimes. (£1016.90 for PE/Playground equipment)	Pupils have access to high quality resources for PE lessons, securing full curriculum coverage and increasing activity levels. At lunchtime, pupils are actively engaged in physical activities; improving both their health and fitness.
The school has been involved in many competitions in our area, including cross-country, swimming, football, tag rugby, netball, triathlon and rounders. We also keep abreast of national and international events and develop opportunities for children to be involved with them in their own way, such as the football World Cup. (£177.03 for staff expenses and £515.70 for competition entry fees and transport)	The school has been particularly successful in boccia and football during 2017-18, where our teams became regional finalists. We also enjoyed success in athletics, rounders, rugby and cross country running events, where several pupils were highly placed in cluster events and some have joined other clubs in the area to pursue table tennis and running.
Total Expenditure for 2017-18 = £19,774.63	

Accountability

Schools are required to include details of their provision of PE and sport on their website, alongside details of their broader curriculum, so that parents can compare sports provision between schools, both within and beyond the school day. Ofsted have strengthened the coverage of PE and sport within the 'Inspectors' handbook', so that both schools and inspectors know how sport and PE will be assessed as part of the school's overall provision. Ofsted will also carry out a survey reporting on the expenditure of this additional funding and its impact.

2018-19

During the academic year 2018-19, the school proposes to use the PE Premium to:

- Purchase a new climbing frame to enhance the physical development of our younger children.
- Provide extensive extra-curricular club and competition opportunities for all children and retain the Gold Schools' Games Mark for 2018-19.
- Continue to facilitate Forest Schools' outdoor and adventurous learning for children.
- Replenish lunchtime play equipment and curriculum resources for PE.
- Apply artificial turf to our Tyre Trail, to increase further activity levels at playtimes and lunchtimes.
