Geography

The children will:

- Continue to locate different countries, continents and oceans on the world map.
- Understand the key aspects of climate zones.

Maths

The children will-

Year 3 will -

- consolidate place value in 2 digit numbers and continue that learning into 3 digits.

Year 4 will -

- understanding the difference between a number and a digit.
