This year, £19,631 Sports Premium funding has been allocated within school to support the development of High Quality Physical Education, Physical Literacy and School Sports for all at Garrett Hall. We have been using this funding with a focus on: equipment, attending competitions, targeting the least active through Change4Life clubs, staff training, use of specialist coaches, focussing on swimming, becoming involved in inclusive sports and also other innovative ways of improving sports within the school.

Sustainability

Our aim at Garrett Hall is to ensure that there will be a continuing legacy to our Sports Premium funding once it has been removed. We believe that this is being achieved through effective professional development in physical education and strategic purchasing of equipment. As detailed below, the funding has had a quantifiable and profound effect on our P.E provisions and we are confident this will be sustained

Believe in Wigan- Martin Lynn Award

Garrett Hall were recognised at the Believe in Wigan Awards this year. The school won the commitment to sport award, competing against all primary and secondary schools in the LEA. This success was supported by the extra funding received by the school through the Sport Premium.

Analysis of impact of extra funding on competitions

Data has been used to analyse the impact of the Sports Premium, comparing competitions attended by Garrett Hall between September 2016- July 2017 to September 2017- July 2018.

Sports Premium money has funded:

- membership of the sporting bodies that run the competitions
- transport to the competitions
- equipment to help practise for the competitions

Swimming

Swimming has continued to be a high priority with in our Garrett Hall sports provision. Provision is provided by the Pelican Centre who offer both skills development and water safety. All children in Year 3 swim weekly throughout the year. This is supplemented by Year 4 swimming for 6 weeks and Year 5 swimming for 12 weeks. This focus on swimming has been shown impact with Garrett Hall taking gold at the Leigh Games this year.

Inclusive Clubs

- Change4life clubs have been started for each year group. These target those less active children to encourage a lifelong love of sport/exercise
- Inclusive 'Just Join In' events have been entered through the Wigan East Schools
- Inclusive Kurling events have been entered through ATSA
- Staff inclusive events have been entered
- Further Kurling and Boccia equipment has been obtained

Use of Sports Premium for CPD ensuring targeted development of staff including the observation of the impact of this training

- Funding has been used to provide clubs before school with the aim of offering wrap around P.E provisions before and after school
- Sport Premium money has been spent on hiring a Sport Coach to deliver CPD
- As part of our rolling program, Year 3 and Reception have 1 hour of P.E CPD per week
- Questionnaires have been used to identify key areas for staff CPD. These has identified, Dance, Gymnastics and O.A.A
- All staff have undertaken a 1 hour CPD giving a refresher course in P.E
- Through analysis of the questionnaires it is clear that the staff rate the quality of the CPD as very high, 100% of the staff rated giving a level 1 rating.

- Through analysis of the questionnaires it is clear that 100% of the staff feel that they have increased confidence in teaching P.E.
- The CPD has been formally observed/monitored by Mr Parr (P.E Co-ordinator) and found to be of a very high standard

Develop leadership of inter- school competitions

- The Sports Premium has funded membership of ATSA (Atherton and Tyldesley Sports Association). Mr Parr and Mr McMahon are trustees of the organisation
- Competitions have also been attended through the School Games
- There has been an increase in the number of competitions attended by KS1 children this year with 50 children taking part in the KS1 Leigh Games

Inclusion G&T

We are working with several agencies to identify talented children and signpost them on to the relevant local sports clubs.

Questionnaires/ Staff Feedback

All staff were given questionnaires about their thoughts on current P.E provision and areas for personal development.

Free School Meals

We have also tried to offer extra opportunities for children accessing Free School Meals. Lunchtime clubs have been run in both Key Stages for this group.
