

### ENGLISH

Read 'The Chocolate Tree: A Mayan Folktale' by Linda Lowery.

### ICT

Use publisher to create a Mayan fact file.  
Locate the Americas and Mexico on Google Earth.  
Digitally draw own Mayan Temple and place onto Google Earth.  
'Picollage' of Mayan mask-making.  
Branching databases.

### HISTORY

Investigate first explorers to discover the Ancient Mayan Civilisation.  
Study of Ancient Mayan society and beliefs and their impact on Modern Mexican and South American culture.  
Investigate Chichen Itza and other important Mayan sites / artefacts.

### MATHS

Numbers to 10,000.  
Addition and Subtraction within 10,000.  
Multiplication and Division.

### GEOGRAPHY

Locating continents, oceans, equator and tropics, North and South American countries on a map / globe.  
Identifying the key physical / human aspects of Mexico.  
Mexican Trade links and Tourism.  
Local study—Tocuaro.
