Here are this term's words for your child to learn. We will repeat them after the half term break.



Week 5	appreciate, competition, environment, leisure, system
Week 6 29.10.18	available, controversy, equipment, marvellous, temperature

We are continuing to use a dictionary to find the meaning of words. They are also useful for finding other words with similar root words - eg question, questionable, questionnaire. When you are reading with your child, please help them to be word detectives and become more used to using a dictionary. If you know how to spell the root word correctly then it is easier to add suffixes and prefixes to make new words.


Harry Potter and the Philosopher's Stone by J.K. Rowling

They hate everything--except playing mean jokes on each other, catching unsuspecting birds to put in their bird pies, and making their caged monkeys, the Muggle-Wumps, stand on their heads all day. But the Muggle-Wumps have had enough.

Grown - ups reading Year 2 onward. Independent reading - Year 3 onwards.
