#### 3. Alteration description

The proposal is to lower the age range of Langtons Infant School from 5-7 to 3-7 years in order to establish a maintained nursery at the school from September 2018.

The current capacity of the school is 270. This proposal intends to make no change to the capacity of the school.

## **Objectives**

The objectives of the proposals.

The objective of this proposal is to lower the age range of Langtons Infant School in order to establish a maintained nursery at the school from 1 September 2018. The implementation of a maintained Nursery at Langtons Infant School will enable the provision of up to (26) full time 3/4 year old places to be admitted into the school's nursery from 1 September 2018.

Langtons Infant School considers that attainment of pupils in the statutory age group will improve if it can offer a continuum of provision from nursery.

A consultation was launched on Monday 14 May 2018 to seek views on the proposal to establish a maintained nursery provision at Langtons Infant School. The full list of persons consulted is as shown in the consultation feedback report.

Consultation involved publishing a consultation document on the Council's website, setting out the reasons for the proposal, options on the type of possible provision arrangements and how comments could be made. This was issued via email to all parents & other stakeholders of Langtons Infant School and hardcopies were also to be made available on request.

This document also invited 'online' participation through the use of 'survey monkey'. The analysis of responses received at the end the consultation period on Friday 8 June 2018 is as detailed in the consultation feedback report. #### Early years provision

The early years provision will be a 26 place nursery for 3 and 4 year olds
To be delivered in 3 hour sessions each day, either am or pm based on 3 and 4
year old funding of 15 hours per week or 30 hours for those eligible families subject
to demand.

How the school will integrate the early years provision with childcare services and how the proposals are consistent with the integration of early years provision for childcare;

Langtons Infant School is a good school and as such has the necessary structure and resources available to successfully establish a new nursery provision to deliver early education and childcare places.

The recent Ofsted noted that the early years provision is good. Leaders have a realistic understanding of children's starting points and children make good progress in the Reception Year. This would enable the school to successfully run and manage a new nursery provision under the strong management and leadership of the school.

Langton's Infant has spare accommodation as numbers are below the published admission number and making use of this accommodation for early years provision will attract additional funding from the children attending and help address the school's difficult financial position.

Evidence of parental demand for additional provision of early years provision;

There is an overwhelming response from parents for the school to have a nursery provision on site as evidenced in the consultation feedback report. The informal consultation carried out by the school amongst parents, pupils, governors, staff and other providers showed that most respondents were supportive of the establishment of a nursery at Langtons Infant School. Parents' experience of a nursery provision on a school site often encourages them to name the school in their preferences when choosing a school place which would again support the school's financial position.

Assessment of capacity, quality and sustainability of provision in schools and in establishments other than schools who deliver the Early Years Foundation Stage within 3 miles of the school; and

There is no maintained nursery provision in the St. Andrew's ward where Langtons Infant school is located. However there are 8 private childcare provider establishments offering either full day or sessional care. Their current position regarding capacity & quality is as highlighted in the table below:

reasons why such schools and establishments who have spare capacity cannot make provision for any forecast increase in the number of such provision.

Our current data shows that there is a surplus places in his area, however any vacancies shown above is still not a true reflection of spare capacity as these vacancies are usually odd days and times which does not meet parental needs or preference.

The consultation survey highlights a demand for early years and childcare places in a nursery setting within a school, therefore the establishment of this nursery provision will help meet this need and create additional 30 hour offer places.

LAs receive funding for nursery provision through the Early Years block of the Dedicated Schools Grant (DSG). The funding is based on participation and is allocated according to the total number of full time equivalent (FTE)3 and 4 year olds attending a provision within Havering at a census date in January 2018 and adjusted for either an increase or decrease in provision at a second census date in January 2019.

The nursery at Langtons Infant School will therefore be funded based on participation (i.e. the numbers on roll) from funding received through the Early Years block of the DSG. Any shortfall in funding caused by a low take up of the places available will be met from the school's delegated budget.

Though our projections currently shows a surplus against the in this ward, however, It is necessary to create new 2 and 3&4 year old places to facilitate the delivery of the two year old and 30 hour offer for those families who qualify for the offer. This diversity enables parents to choose a provider that best meets the needs of their child and family.

By implementing new nursery provision at Langtons Infant School it will help create additional early years and expand childcare choice for parents in the local area who may wish to take up the early education and childcare for 3 & 4 year olds and the 30hours extended entitlement offer in a maintained nursery provision within a

school setting.

The school has recognised that having a nursery provision on site is a good way of ensuring that children feed into the school so the school roll is boosted too and this will help with the numbers in Reception onwards.
