

KS1 Around the World!

Science/Maths

Have a look at a wonderful endangered animal. Can you find out how many of these animals are left and build a habitat for that animal to help it survive? Use a shoebox and other materials you can find around your house.

You could also get involved in a bird watch. Look outside to see how many birds you can spot. Can you record your results in a tally chart and a bar chart? How many different types of birds can you find?

Literacy/Art

Research a famous landmark from around the world. Can you make a 3d model of it and retell the story of how this landmark came about?

Can you create an 'Around the World' board game? Where will we visit in the game? Show us how you would like to make us think about the world! Don't forget to write the instructions!

Other ideas!

Visit a new place in England that you haven't been before. Can you design a poster of it? Tell us what you did, how you got there and what interesting facts there are.

Remember the game of top trumps? Now it's your turn to make your own version. This can be of landmarks, countries, animals or any other exciting thing around the world. Make sure you play a few games first to help inspire you!

For your homework project choose at least two activities below to complete for Monday 10th December.

Literacy/ICT

Using ICT can you create a poster or a PowerPoint about your favourite country to present to the class? Research some interesting facts about the country. Which continent is it in? How many people live there? What does the flag look like?

Geography

Learn to speak another language! Learning a language is a key to the rest of the world. Ask someone whether they can speak in another language and ask them to teach you. Let's see how many ways Greens Norton can say hello!

Trying new foods is a great way to explore a new country. Can you try to make some new food from around the world with the help of a grown up? Take some pictures, or bring it in to try. The more interesting the better!

Art and design

Can you paint a picture of a famous landmark? Which landmarks have you seen and which would you like to have a go at drawing. Why not bring it in for us to guess what it is?

Create a map of your journey to school. How do you get here? What do you pass on your way? Use lots of pictures and exciting information to bring it to life!
