We have had a very good start to the year; the children have settled in well and have already produced some pleasing work. This year, we are looking forward to exploring the Stone Age to Iron Age periods, developing new Maths strategies and reading a variety of texts in Literacy.

We are encouraging the children to show how they apply our school values and it has been great to see Year 3 pupils already receiving values certificates and badges.

Core Subjects

English and Literacy

Reading

Pupils have opportunities to read a wide variety of books and text types, both in class and in the library. Please ensure your child reads to an adult at least three times a week and their Home Contact book is then signed. They will be given the opportunity to do a quiz after each book before they change it.

We will be doing regular comprehension work in class in order to develop these skills when working independently.

Writing

In Literacy we have been reading and basing our work on *'The BFG'* and focussing on settings and description. We are also looking at Shape poetry and creating our own poems using powerful language. After half-term, we will be reading *'The Day I Swapped My Dad for Two Goldfish.'*

Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar

The children will be given a list of spellings to learn on Monday and will then be tested the following Monday. These spellings will be appropriate for each pupil and linked to the rules children are expected to know in Year 3.

Please try to find time to help your child learn these words – 10 minutes 5 times per week is ideal.

Maths and Numeracy

In Maths, we have been focussing on developing pupils' understanding of place value for numbers up to 1000; this has included the use of many practical resources. We will also be exploring the rules of addition and subtraction and learning new methods. The pupils will learn to apply what they learn to solving simple problems.

Science

In Science, we have been learning about magnets and how they attract and repel. Next half-term, we will be finding out about Rocks and Soils.



Foundation Subjects

Topic (History and Geography)

We are currently studying the Stone Age to Iron Age periods and have enjoyed finding out about woolly mammoths. We have compared our own lives to those of Stone Age children.

After half-term, in Geography we will be finding out about Deserts.



Art and Design Technology

This half-term, the children have been practising mixing paint colours and looking at Cezanne's still life pictures. They produced some lovely BFG silhouettes. Next half-term, we will be making pop-up storybooks in DT.

Computing

In Computing, the children have learnt how to produce simple documents using Microsoft Word. After half-term, we will be creating e-books.

French

Year 3 pupils have made an encouraging start learning greetings and will also be learning numbers and colours later this term.

Music

The children have enjoyed their Music lessons so far and have been learning to play glockenspiels. They will also be developing their singing skills and learning recorders this term.

Physical Education and Sport

This term, Year 3 will be doing Football, Gymnastics and Netball.



Religious Education

Our first RE Week will take place straight after half-term. This term we will be thinking about 'What are the deeper meanings of the Festivals?' and will be comparing Christmas and Eid ul Fitr.

Personal, Social and Health Education (PSHE)

This term Year 3 will be discussing how we can be healthy and how we can stay safe.

Homework

An alternate Maths and Literacy Homework task will be set each week on Tuesdays. This should be returned to school by the following Monday please.

These tasks are linked to work covered in class and your child should be able to complete them independently. However, please feel free to support them with this should they need it.

Homework should be completed in blue handwriting pen or pencil, whichever the pupil uses at school.

Weekly spellings are set on Mondays and tested the following Mondays.

Please listen to your child read a minimum of 3 times per week and sign their Home Contact book.

Please help your child to learn their x tables. This will be an ongoing activity throughout the year. By the end of Year 3, they should be confident in knowing and applying x2, x3, x4, x5, x8, x10.
