Core Subjects

English and Literacy

Reading

We have been reading – *There's a Boy In the Girls' Bathroom* by Louis Sacher. The children have thoroughly enjoyed the story so far. Please ensure that your child reads to an adult at least three times a week (more is better) and that this is recorded in the home/school book.

Writing

The children will be writing in a variety of styles between now and Christmas: journal entries, reports, poetry and alternative endings to famous stories will all be studied. As we work through these genres the class will have the opportunity to read examples, identify key parts, draft, plan and edit their work. Once they have planned and drafted the children then get the opportunity to write in their 'special' red books.

Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar

Children will be given a list of spellings each week to learn at home, these will be based on the rules children are required to learn in Year 5. Children will be tested on a weekly basis.

Maths and Numeracy

We shall be developing the children's ability to use mental and written methods of calculation. The children will also be developing their ability to reason and solve problems within mathematics.

Science

This term the topic is *Materials*; we will be planning, conducting and evaluating a variety of experiments within this subject.

Foundation Subjects

Topic (History and Geography)

Our topic this term is Ancient Egypt; we shall be learning about the importance of the river Nile, Egyptian gods and special Egyptian artefacts.

Art and Design Technology

We shall be looking at a variety of famous still life artists. The children will then be given time to practise the different sketching techniques and then plan and create their own still life art.

Computing

We shall be researching Egypt and learning about programming.

French

The children will be looking at improving their French greetings and also learning how to describe themselves and others.

Music

We shall be learning to play simple chords on the guitar.

Physical Education and Sport

The children will be participating in rugby and netball. They will also be taught about the importance of warming up and down for sport.

Religious Education

This term the children will be learning about Hinduism; we will be visiting a local temple learning about Hindu gods, studying Hindu festivals and also reading some famous Hindu stories.

Personal, Social and Health Education (PSHE)

This term the children will be learning how to stay fit and healthy and studying how people change as they grow.

Homework.

Each week your child will be given either Maths or English. They will also be expected to read at least three times per week.
