Next Week in English

Year 3

Next week in Year 3, we will be writing our own recounts. We are learning about using paragraphs, adverbials and writing in the first person.

Year 4

Year 4 will be learning about persuasive writing. We will be learning about the persuasive features of a written advert and planning and creating one of our own.

Year 5

Year 5 have been writing some brilliant suspense stories using flash-backs this week. Next week, they will be exploring a new non-fiction text.

Year 6

Next week, Year 6 will be creating our own suspense stories. The toolkit we created this week will help us include the features that a good quality suspense story has. Our stories will include figurative language and we will be using a variety of punctuation.

Next Week in Maths

Year 3

Next week in maths, Year 3 will be continuing our new unit about mental addition. We will be learning strategies to help us to mentally add one, two and three digit numbers quickly.

Year 4

Next week, we are continuing our mental maths strategies and applying this knowledge in different contexts.

Year 5

Next week, we will be identifying and comparing multiples and factors, including finding all factor pairs of a number, and common factors.

Year 6

Next week, Year 6 will learn about performing mental calculation, which includes mixed operations and large numbers. This will involve solving addition and subtraction multi-step problems and deciding which method is the best to use and why.
