## Humanities

Anglo-Saxons and Vikings: who were they, where did they come from and why did they settle in Britain? This will include discussing British Values alongside using historical and geographical skills.



## Science

Materials and their properties: exploring the world around us and looking at the properties of different natural and artificial materials and how they interact with each other. They'll be lots of fizz, bang and pop with exciting investigations.
