Foundation

In Foundation, we have been very busy learning all about Harvest. We have explored different harvested fruits and vegetables: naming, drawing, painting and even using them to create portraits inspired by the artist Guseppie Acrimboldo. We have discussed how some people celebrate Harvest Festival and how it is a good time to think about all the things we are thankful for. We have also been doing lots of retelling of the story of The Little Red Hen, and just like the Red Hen does in the story, the children have been baking their own bread.



Class 1 & 2

Year 1 and 2 really enjoyed No Pens Day last week. First, they found lots of creative ways to practice their spellings! We wrote our key words in play dough, shaving foam, glitter and with magnets.

In English, we used our story maps to retell the Beegu story and then asked children to become Beegu and sit on the 'hot seat' to answer questions from the class. In the afternoon, the class decided that they wanted to use the beautiful autumn leaves in the yard to make fire inspired pictures for our Great Fire of London topic.

In science, we are continuing to find out about the changes in weather throughout the year. We made rain gauges and set them up in the yard to find out how much rain falls in our yard over the coming weeks.
