If you are using a computer in an Internet café or one that belongs to someone you don't know, or one that is not yours. 'Be careful'. They can have things like 'spyware' on them. This takes your details secretly and passes it on to people who may cause you harm or upset.

This records what letters and numbers you have pressed on the keyboard (like passwords) and sends it to whoever set the key logger up.

Think carefully about the information you are sending on these public computers and try to avoid giving any personal information when using devices that are not your own.

They might have **viruses** too, so if you send a friend an e-mail you could infect them- not friendly.
