## Next Week in English

### Year 3

In English, we will independently write a recount following our Stone Age Day on Monday. We will focus on time adverbials to sequence events and writing in paragraphs.

### Year 4

Next week in Year 4, we are writing about our new invention through a persuasive writing medium. We will edit and improve this, and produce some work for display.

### Year 5

Year 5 are continuing to explore an explanation text next week. This will include looking at the features and techniques that need to be used in it. They will then plan their own text.

### Year 6

Next week, Year 6 will be editing and writing the final draft of our own suspense stories. The stories will include the features from the toolkit and the class will be using a range of punctuation. This final piece will be written in our writing portfolios.

## Next Week in Maths

### Year 3

Next week, we will continue to learn methods for mental addition and to select our preferred or most appropriate methods.

### Year 4

Next week in Year 4 maths, we will be looking at formal written methods for addition and subtraction and applying these skills through problem solving.

### Year 5

Next week in maths, we will be identifying what makes a number a prime number and learning how to know the difference between prime and composite numbers. We will then look at building composite numbers from prime factors.

### Year 6

Next week, Year 6 will identify common factors, common multiples and primes. This will include performing mental calculations, with mixed operations and large numbers.
