

SPORT PREMIUM – 2017-18 Funding to support Primary PE and School Sport

Background

- In September 2017, the Government announced significant, new increased funding for all schools for physical education (PE) and sport. It is crucial that as a school, we invest this money wisely in order to cover the following areas:
 - Engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity – 30 mins per day
 - Raise the profile of PE and Sport across the whole school
 - Increase confidence, knowledge and skill of all staff in teaching PE and sport
 - Broaden the experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils
 - Increase participation in competitive sport
- Hatherley Infant School will receive £16000 plus an additional funding of £10 per pupil. This gives a total of **£17740**
- Alongside Maths and English, Sports Premium will be the third area to be inspected by Ofsted therefore it is vitally important that we utilise the funding effectively.

Hatherley Infant School plan

- At our school we are planning to invest this additional funding into increasing physical activity for all pupils within their school day. In order to do this we are having a large climbing apparatus installed in the playground. All children will benefit from using the equipment thus improving their fundamental skills of balance, agility and co-ordination.
- We have invested in a new PE scheme for teaching PE across the school. REAL PE includes all training and resources for EYFS and KS1. The scheme, which focusses on improving children's physical literacy will have a direct impact thus enabling us to provide high quality teaching and learning; ensuring that all children can succeed. It will raise the profile of PE and sport within the school.
- We are ensuring that we provide all children with a minimum of 30 minutes physical activity per day by continuing with our wake and shake sessions, introducing the 'daily mile' during 'lulls' in learning time and providing a range of after school free activities including Zumba and Boxercise. In addition, two member of staff are attending training on Active Classrooms. Children who wish to take their learning further will be supported to extend to their full potential through a range of festivals and competitions.
- Dance has been an area in which most staff would like to develop. Therefore we are intending to improve teacher confidence through the support of a local dance specialist. She will work with all teachers and all children within the school for a period of two and a half days. During this time, staff will gain ideas, support and resources in order to develop their own teaching in the spring term.

With our allocated funding of **£17,740** plus balance carried over from last year **£4838** we have a total of **£22,578**

We are focusing our sports premium on the following areas:
