Guidelines to prevent bullying

Bullying is something which worries children, staff and parents. It is the wilful, conscious desire to hurt, threaten or frighten someone else and may manifest itself in physical or verbal behaviour and through cyber bullying; different things frighten different children.

We try very hard to make sure your children are safe in school by:-

- having adequate supervision at all times;
- talking to children about being safe inside and outside of school;
- having assemblies and role play in the classroom about bullies and how to deal with them;
- taking appropriate action.

Please refer to the school's behaviour policy, approved by staff and governors, which gives more information about how bullying is dealt with.

(All incidents of bullying will be taken seriously and investigated thoroughly. Parents/carers will be asked to treat staff with respect when they wish to discuss a concern. The Executive Headteacher/Head of School will speak to any parent who is aggressive and will take relevant action as required, which may result in the parent being denied access to the school grounds and building, by the governors, in extreme circumstances.)
