

# Radcliffe Primary School's Sports Report

## What is the Sports Premium?

The government is providing £150 million per annum over the last three years to provide substantial new funding for primary school sport. The funding is being jointly provided by the Departments for Education, Health, and Culture, Media and Sport, with the money going directly to primary school Head Teachers to spend on improving the quality of sport and PE for all their children. Each school will receive £8,000 plus an extra £5 per pupil each year for the next two years.

Here at Radcliffe Primary that will mean we receive around £18,000 a year. Schools must spend the sports funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but have the freedom to choose how they spend it.

## We are using our sports grant to:

- Pay our own sports and PE coach to lead PE and train other staff to deliver high quality PE lessons
- Train and pay our own in-house Sports Coach
- Funding the Sports Coach to gain further coaching qualifications
- Provide sports training for staff
- Train children as Sports Crew Leaders to act as role models and support the development of skills in other children
- Increase the participation of girls and boys in intra and interschool tournaments and competitions for KS1 and KS2
- Improve the P.E equipment that the pupils have access to in order to improve specific skills in a range of sporting areas.
- Subsidise the cost of our Year 6 residential trip to Robinwood.
