- Attend parents' meetings and consultations
- Ensure that my child wears the school uniform and regulation footwear, has P.E. kit in school
- Support my child with homework and other opportunities for home learning
- Support the schools approach to on-line safety and not deliberately upload or add any text, image, sound or videos that could upset or offend any member of the school community

It was a great success and we raised an amazing £284.19. Thank you once again for your support!


School Photographer
