

Pupil premium grant impact statement

Pupil premium grant for 2017 to 2018

St Patrick's Catholic Primary currently has **78 pupils (37.7%)** receiving pupil premium (PP).

This report will provide inspectors with a current indicator of how many pupils are in receipt of the pupil premium across the school.

By including 'more able' data, this clearly provides evidence that the school is investigating the impact on all pupils; so, in this example, 10 out of the 45 are identified as more able pupil premium.
