Actual funding 2017-18 - £17,990***

“Sports Premium funding is provided by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport, and the money goes directly to primary school head teachers to spend on improving the quality of sport and PE for all their children.” DFE June 2013

Aston C of E welcomes the news from the DFE that sport premium for 2017-18 has been increased and will use the sport premium funding in the following areas –

- To increase staff knowledge and skills in delivering a range of different aspects of PE and sport.
- To increase children’s engagement in a range of PE and sport activities by promoting clubs and activities outside the normal school day and at lunchtimes, developing an awareness in all children of the importance of healthy eating and being active
- To increase the amount of competitive sport opportunities for all children in school including opportunities to compete with other schools in the local and wider communities.

91% of Year 6 pupils who left in July 2017 could swim competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of at least 25 metres.
