<b>Focussed 1:1 educational support</b>	£6300	Focussed, individualised educational plan outside of the classroom for children who are not yet meeting age related expectations. Some of these are PP pupils.	Pupils continue to access the curriculum and education inside and outside of the classroom. Behaviour is supported at all times where relevant.	Pupils behaviour and learning is supported at all times.	Staff and pupils have been supported in managing pupils behavior more effectively
<b>Flexible behaviour support</b>	£18000	Non-specific class based LSA support for pupil premium pupils who display challenging behaviour. LSA is able to support within the class or remove the child if necessary, returning when appropriate. Children access appropriate educational activities away from the classroom.	Children struggling to control behaviour are supported when necessary.	Pupils are better equipped and feel supported enough to control their behaviour. Less episodes of challenging behaviour. <b>Sports and after school Clubs</b>	£410	Pupil premium pupils who are in financial difficulties, are offered opportunities to take part in extra-curricular activities, either free of charge or at a subsidised cost.
