The story was incredibly moving and told of two soldiers, Major Adams and Private Edward. Children from Horfield sang the part of soldiers going to war and returning at the end of four long years. Mrs Steel sang the part of Ivy, Major Adam's wife beautifully and the children and soloists were accompanied by Mrs Alsop on the organ together with percussion and brass. The opera was written by Mark Lawrence who leads the boys' choir and teachers' voice at Horfield. At the back of the church glass poppies were displayed, which were made by the children as part of the project. It was utterly amazing and the children thoroughly deserved their two standing ovations.


School Dinners
