Science

This term, we will be learning about the properties of solids and liquids along with investigating reversible changes, freezing and melting. We will conduct an experiment to review the rates from freezing to melting. We will also use practical models to show how the molecules are dispersed in different states of matter.

Thematic Curriculum (History, Geography, DT)

Our topic is Rebellious Romans where we will explore the Roman Empire and its impact on Britain. This will include; Julius Caesar's invasion, the Roman Empire by 42AD and the power of its army, Claudius invasion and conquest, British resistance (Boudica) and Romanisation of British sites.
