# Mayfield CE Primary School Uniform

## Winter Uniform for Girls to be worn in Terms 2, 3 and 4

- Grey skirt, pinafore or grey school trousers
- White polo shirt (KS1) or white shirt (KS2)
- Royal blue and gold tie (Key Stage 2 only. Year 3 and 4 may wear an elasticated tie)
- Royal blue 'V' necked jumper or cardigan with the school logo
- Grey tights or white socks (no grey socks please)
- Black shoes (boots, heels or slip on shoes are unsuitable)
- Simple blue, black or brown hair ties or hair clips.

## Winter Uniform for Boys to be worn in Terms 2, 3 and 4

- Grey trousers
- White polo shirt (KS1) White shirt (KS2)
- Royal blue and gold tie (Key Stage 2 only. Year 3 and 4 may wear an elasticated tie)
- Royal blue 'V' necked jumper with school logo
- Grey/black plain socks
- Black shoes (trainers or boots are unsuitable)
  
- **Blue Fleeces** with the school logo are optional and for outdoor use only. Please note that this is not an alternative to the school jumper.
  
- **Jewellery** (other than a small pair of stud earrings) and nail varnish is not allowed. It is expected that earrings are removed for PE sessions.
