

Sports Premium Report – 2018-2019

The Government is providing additional P.E. and Sports funding for the academic year 2018-2019 to continue improving provision of physical education (P.E.) and sport in Primary Schools. Schools must spend the additional funding on improving their provision of P.E. and sport.

To ensure sustainability and effective use of this investment, it is important that we invest the money in a range of ways that aim to:

- Increase engagement of pupils in sport
- Raise the profile of P.E. AND Sport in school
- Increase confidence, knowledge and skills of staff across the school
- Broaden the range of sports that are offered to pupils
- Increase participation in competitive sport
- Provide new resources and outdoor facilities

At St. Richard's we believe that all pupils in our care should be physically literate with the knowledge, skills and motivation necessary to equip them for a healthy lifestyle and lifelong participation in sport. We know that an innovative, varied and well balanced P.E. curriculum and extra - curricular opportunities can have a positive impact on pupils' concentration, attitude and academic achievement.

For 2017/18 there is a requirement to publish information about how many pupils in our Year 6 class are meeting the national curriculum requirement to swim competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of at least 25 metres, use a range of strokes effectively and perform safe self-rescue in different water based situations.
