	Maths	English
Week One	Division—short division and division using factors.	Detective Stories—drafting and writing narratives combining description, dialogue and action.
Week Two	Division—long division.	Detective Stories— evaluating and editing the effectiveness of writing.
Week Three	Number— factors, multiples and prime numbers.	Discussion Texts—Looking at a range of discussion texts
Week Four	Fractions—simplifying fractions and fractions on a number line.	Discussion Texts—Learning different techniques when writing a balanced argument.
Week Five	Fractions—adding and subtracting fractions.	Discussion Texts—holding a debate.
Week Six	Fractions—multiplying fractions.	Spy Stories—Understanding how characters are developed through description and dialogue.
Week Seven	Fractions—dividing fractions.	Spy Stories—writing an atmospheric exchange between a spy and their arch nemesis.

Curriculum

We will be continuing with our 'Crime and Punishment' topic. This half term in history, we will be learning more about punishments in the past and then using this information to inspire our learning in DT. When learning about spy stories in English, we will be combining this with learning about position and direction and using maps and atlases to locate countries in geography. In science the children will be learning about light while in computing they will be continuing with their App design project. Our theme in PSHE is 'Celebrating Differences' while in RE the children will be focusing on the key question 'What Would Jesus Do?'.
