4. Desired outcomes

	<i>Success criteria</i>
A.	Attainment in reading, writing and mathematics improves for PP children across all year groups.
	Attainment data will be reviewed termly. Termly assessments will show that the difference between PP and non PP children is diminishing. End of KS1 results will show improvements on last year for the attainment of PP children and the difference between PP and non PP children will close.
B.	PP children will have improved knowledge, understanding and emotional awareness of the world and will be able to apply this to their school work.
	PP children will attend trips and other enrichments to the curriculum. More PP children will take part in enrichments and extra-curricular activities than in previous years. Termly assessments will show that the gap between PP and non PP children is closing.
