Year Group: 1

Topic: Toy Story

Literacy

In Year 1 we will continue to follow the Success for All programme.

- The children will read high quality books, with specific reading skills being modelled and taught over the course of a week or two, before a written outcome is produced based on the text.
- Please see individual class teachers for more info on your child's specific units.

Science

In Science we will be exploring different materials. We will be learning to identify a range of different materials, be able to distinguish between objects and the materials they are made from and will be able to describe the properties of these materials. We will also look at the changes in our surroundings as we move through the winter season.

PE

- PE days will be on Tuesdays and Wednesdays. The PE kit currently consists of a white t-shirt with black shorts/jogging bottoms and trainers.
- We have worked hard to include a number of new and exciting sports.

History, Geography, Art, Music D&T and ICT

In History we will be looking at and finding out about toys from the past. We will use our knowledge and understanding to sort, classify and sequence the history of toys. We will be having a special visit from the museum where we will be able to play and learn about toys from the past and we will develop some questions that we can ask our visitor.

In Computing we will be learning to write algorithms, as well as learning how to programme toys.

In D&T we will be designing and making our own pop up toy.

In Geography we will be looking at seasonal weather changes.

Numeracy

In Numeracy we will be following the Maths No Problem programme. We will start the half term exploring position, including comparing the position of different objects. We will then move onto number and place value within higher numbers, comparing and ordering these.

PSHCE and RE

In PSHCE the children will be learning about the different emotions they might feel, how to recognise these and how they can deal with them.

In R.E children will be thinking about special places and what makes a church a special place for a Christian. We will be visiting Reverend Mark at Paston church to look at how Christians keep the church a special place.

Homework

- Reading: To be practiced at home every day, children will change their books when they have read.
- Phonics and Maths: Phonics and maths homework will be set every Thursday and needs to be handed in the following Tuesday.
