Privacy notice for parents/carers – use of your child’s personal data

Under data protection law, individuals have a right to be informed about how the school uses any personal data that we hold about them. We comply with this right by providing ‘privacy notices’ (sometimes called ‘fair processing notices’) to individuals where we are processing their personal data.

This privacy notice explains how we collect, store and use personal data about **pupils**.

We, Short Heath Federation are the ‘data controller’ for the purposes of data protection law.

We have appointed a Data Protection Officer from Services 4 Schools Ltd (see ‘Contact us’ below).

The personal data we hold

Personal data that we may collect, use, store and share (when appropriate) about pupils includes, but is not restricted to:

- Contact information, including date of birth, addresses, phone numbers and email addresses of parents and/or any other emergency contacts
- Results of internal assessments and externally set tests
- Pupil and curricular records
- Characteristics, such as ethnic background, eligibility for free school meals, or special educational needs
- Exclusion information
- Details of any medical conditions, including physical and mental health
- Attendance information
- Safeguarding information
- Details of any support received, including care packages, plans and support providers
- Photographs
- CCTV images captured in school
- Financial information, e.g. account and transactional information for school meals
- Information pertaining to home life where appropriate, e.g. where a pupil is identified as having a mental health issue or there are safeguarding concerns

We may also hold data about pupils that we have received from other organisations, including other schools, local authorities and the Department for Education.

Why we use this data

We use this data to:

- Support pupil learning
- Monitor and report on pupil progress
- Provide appropriate pastoral care
- Protect pupil welfare
- Assess the quality of our services
- Administer admissions waiting lists

- Carry out research
- Comply with the law regarding data sharing

Our legal basis for using this data

Short Heath Federation holds the right to collect and use personal data relating to pupils and their families, and we may also receive information regarding them from their previous school, local authorities and / or the DfE. We collect and use personal data in order to meet legal requirements and legitimate interests set out in the GDPR and UK law, including those in relation to the following:

- Article 6 and Article 9 of the GDPR
- Education Act 1996
- Regulation 5 of The Education (Information About Individual Pupils) (England) Regulations 2013

We only collect and use pupils' personal data when the law allows us to. Most commonly, we process it where:

- We need to comply with a legal obligation
- We need it to perform an official task in the public interest

Less commonly, we may also process pupils' personal data in situations where:

- We have obtained consent to use it in a certain way
- We need to protect the individual's vital interests (or someone else's interests)

Where we have obtained consent to use pupils' personal data, this consent can be withdrawn at any time. We will make this clear when we ask for consent, and explain how consent can be withdrawn.

Some of the reasons listed above for collecting and using pupils' personal data overlap, and there may be several grounds which justify our use of this data.

Collecting this information

While the majority of information we collect about pupils is mandatory, there is some information that can be provided voluntarily.

Whenever we seek to collect information from you or your child, we make it clear whether providing it is mandatory or optional. If it is mandatory, we will explain the possible consequences of not complying.

How we store this data

We keep personal information about pupils while they are attending our school. We may also keep it beyond their attendance at our school if this is necessary in order to comply with our legal obligations. The school has adopted the [Information and Records Management Society's toolkit for schools](#) created by the IRMS and adheres to its principles and guidance.

Data sharing.

We do not share information about pupils with any third party without consent unless the law and our policies allow us to do so.

Where it is legally required, or necessary (and it complies with data protection law) we may share personal information about pupils with:

Governing Authorities / Departments

- Our local authority and its agencies – Walsall LA, Social Services, Admissions & Appeals, SEND Team, LAC Team - to meet our legal obligations to share certain information with it, such as safeguarding concerns and exclusions

- Other Local Authorities (as needed)
- Pupils destinations upon leaving the school
- The Department for Education - on a statutory basis. This data sharing underpins school funding and educational attainment policy and monitoring.
- External Agencies – Welfare Support, Inclusion Services, Behaviour Services
- Our regulator e.g. Ofsted, - to meet our legal obligations to share certain information with it, such as pupil progress for key groups and cohorts, safeguarding cases, responses to incidents and complaints.
- Lichfield Diocesan Board of Education

Education Services.Contracts/Consultancy

- The providers of therapy and support services
- Education Psychologists
- Our appointed school photographer - Tempest
- The pupil's family and representatives – to meet our legal obligations to share certain information with them, such as pupil progress and incident logs.
- Educators and examining bodies – to meet our legal obligations to share certain information with them, such as pupil details and examination papers.
- Our auditors – Walsall LA, to enable them to provide the service we have contracted them for.
- The local NHS Trust and other health professionals, e.g. School Nurses – to meet our legal obligations to share certain information with them, such as pupil progress data for key groups and cohorts, safeguarding cases, responses to incidents and complaints, social and health trend data.
- Contract Catering Services – Shires
- Contract Data Management Services – Walsall LA
- Contract IT Support Services – LA ICT
- Professional advisers and consultants - to meet our legal obligations to share certain information with them, such as pupil progress data for key groups and cohorts, safeguarding cases, responses to incidents and complaints and to enable them to provide the service we have contracted them for.
- Police forces, courts, tribunals - to meet our legal obligations to share certain information with them, such as pupil progress data for key groups and cohorts, safeguarding cases, responses to incidents and complaints.
- Professional bodies - to meet our legal obligations to share certain information with them, such as pupil progress data for key groups and cohorts, safeguarding cases, responses to incidents and complaints and to enable them to provide the service we have contracted them for.

Systems/software

- The providers of our management information system – Capita Sims
- The providers of software used to communicate with you – Parentpay; Marvellous Me
- The providers of our safeguarding system – CPOMS
- The providers of our CCTV system - MVTEK
- The system we use to record progress in learning – School Pupil Tracker
- The online software we use to help deliver the curriculum – Cyber Coach Smart; Curriculum Visions; Bug Club; Charanga; TT Rock Stars;
- The software we use to provide cashless payments – Parentpay, sQUID

National Pupil Database

We are required to provide information about pupils to the Department for Education as part of statutory data collections such as the school census and early years census under regulation 5 of The Education (Information about Individual Pupils) (England) Regulations 2013.

Some of this information is then stored in the [National Pupil Database](#) (NPD), which is owned and managed by the Department and provides evidence on school performance to inform research.

The database is held electronically so it can easily be turned into statistics. The information is securely collected from a range of sources including schools, local authorities and exam boards.

The Department for Education may share information from the NPD with other organisations which promote children's education or wellbeing in England. Such organisations must agree to strict terms and conditions about how they will use the data.

Parents and pupils' rights regarding personal data

Individuals have a right to make a '**subject access request**' to gain access to personal information that the school holds about them.

Parents/carers can make a request with respect to their child's data where the child is not considered mature enough to understand their rights over their own data (usually under the age of 12), or where the child has provided consent.

Parents also have the right to make a subject access request with respect to any personal data the school holds about them .

If you make a subject access request, and if we do hold information about you or your child, we will:

- Give you a description of it
- Tell you why we are holding and processing it, and how long we will keep it for
- Explain where we got it from, if not from you or your child
- Tell you who it has been, or will be, shared with
- Let you know whether any automated decision-making is being applied to the data, and any consequences of this
- Give you a copy of the information in an intelligible form

Individuals also have the right for their personal information to be transmitted electronically to another organisation in certain circumstances.

Other rights

Under data protection law, individuals have certain rights regarding how their personal data is used and kept safe, including the right to:

- Object to the use of personal data if it would cause, or is causing, damage or distress

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- Prevent it being used to send direct marketing
- Object to decisions being taken by automated means (by a computer or machine, rather than by a person)
- In certain circumstances, have inaccurate personal data corrected, deleted or destroyed, or restrict processing
- Claim compensation for damages caused by a breach of the data protection regulations

Complaints

We take any complaints about our collection and use of personal information very seriously.

If you think that our collection or use of personal information is unfair, misleading or inappropriate, or have any other concern about our data processing, please raise this with us in the first instance.
